**DETAILS OF INCIDENT:** On 05/05/11, at approximately 8:45 A. M., Deputy Canfield of the Grant County Sheriff's Department, was responding to an alarm call. He was traveling near the 3000 block of Broadway Avenue, with his overhead patrol lights activated. Deputy Canfield noticed a vehicle behind him following very closely. The vehicle, a 1998 Suzuki was up near the patrol vehicles rear bumper. The deputy attempted to move over and allow the vehicle to pass, however, the vehicle again moved in right behind the patrol vehicle. The deputy felt that the vehicle was trying to ram him, and tried other evasive moves., however the suspect vehicle continued to follow him very closely. Moses Lake Police officers responded and pulled in behind the suspect vehicle in an attempt to stop it. The vehicle eluded the officers and continued traveling eastbound on Broadway. The vehicle continued following the deputy eastbound on Broadway to Gumwood. The deputy and the vehicle turned on to Gumwood Street and then on to Third Avenue. The vehicle was finally stopped near cedar street. The suspect was arrested for attempted assault, and vehicle eluding and booked into the Grant County Jail. The suspect was later treated at Samaritan hospital after it was suspected that he ingested cocaine.
